The Extension Area Specialist will coordinate Regional wide educational events for FCS, AG, 4-H, and CED programs. They coordinate statewide initiatives structured to local program needs. Extension Area Specialists assist other Extension workers in special program activities and events relative to all Extension program areas and markets the total Extension program. They look to the department appropriate to discipline they are working in for training, materials, and program support.

Responsibilities

- Give leadership to an on-going educational event that meets client needs.
- Organizes all details within program area including housing, catering, entertainment, transportation, location and equipment.
- Provide technical and subject matter assistance to county staff, assist with developing and delivering agent training, and program specific events.
- Develop and maintain program support and effectiveness through partnerships and collaborative efforts with agencies, associations, organizations, volunteers, and others.
- Remain current in area of expertise as well as other program areas to effectively coordinate and deliver educational programs.
- Must Provide leadership for a program of activities that meets the needs of all eligible clientele regardless of race, color, national origin, age, sex, disability, religion, or veteran status.
